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# **OUR VISION**

At In-Sight, we believe in art education for everyone. The In-Sight Photography Project was founded in 1992 by Bill Ledger and John Willis as a free summer photography class for youth. Bill and John found themselves distracted by the large number of teenagers hanging around downtown Brattleboro with no place to go and little to do. Through decades of community support, this onetime class has grown over the past 28 years into year round programming that serves hundreds of youth annually. Courses in photography and related visual arts are taught at the introductory, intermediate and advanced levels for students ages 11 to 21. While In-Sight itself has gone through tremendous growth, our mission has stayed the same: teach young people to voice their perspectives, develop respect for others, and contribute to their community through photography, regardless of financial barriers.







## DEAR FRIENDS OF IN-SIGHT,

In-sight's plans for 2020 were ambitious. Settled into our new facility, we kicked off the year with a new event in celebration of the Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service – offering free professional portrait sessions to the public. With a mission to provideyouth access to the arts—photography in particular—regardless of financial barriers, free, professional portraits was our way of expanding our mission toinclude the greater community. That day we engaged 67 people, capturingmoments for individuals and families and creating headshots to advance professionals in their line of work.

In March, the COVID-19 pandemic hit. We adapted our programming by leaps and bounds, moved programming online and launched #insightphotosquad, a community-wide call for photos that culminated in a beautiful outdoor display of work submitted. As we recognized screen-time fatigue and a lack of access to reliable internet with our students, we launched "Boredom Buster" kits as a hands-on alternative. These kits are mailed out with all the supplies needed to make Cyanotypes (sun prints), zines, or they include film and a point and shoot camera to use at home. For the Summer, we were able to bring back small, inperson classes and relished the ability to connect safely with our students. In August, In-Sight sponsored an online Lunchtime Artist Talk Series bringing the community we missed so greatly back into our space, albeit virtually. In-sight's annual photographic auction went online for the month of September and we shared the proceeds with two other visual media and social justice organizations.

2020 was challenging in so many ways – we had to reinvent our programming and adapt our work in ways we could never have imagined. Despite the uncertainty, In-Sight and all of those who support our mission showed up in the most creative, resilient ways possible. Thank you for being by our side through it all.


#### LILY LAGRANGE

# PARTNERSHIPS

In-Sight Photography Project is connected to our Southern Vermont Community through partnerships with other organizations and neighborhood initiatives.

#### **KINDLE FARM**

During the school day Students from Kindle Farm who were interested in Photography were able to come to In-Sight and utilize our resources. From photograms to lighting a photoshoot, nothing was off limits. Teachers from Kindle Farm were able to learn alongside their students and take these skills back to campus to their families.

#### CYANOTYPE INTENSIVE WITH ASK THE RIVER

While we couldn't have an in-person cyanotype class collaboration with *Ask the River* this year, we got creative and ran an online intensive in July. A group of students from 5 different states came together virtually to learn all about the cyanotype process and make their very own cyanotypes from kits mailed to their doorstep. With *Ask the River* we thought about our relationship with water and nature, discussed the importance of community and artist relationships and made cyanotype masks.

#### SUMMER GARDEN PROGRAM

In-Sight, along with other local artists and organizations, partnered with the Summer Garden Art Series through FoodConnects in Brattleboro. Because of COVID-19 we were able to design and implement a new partnership style. Rather than In-Sight staff taking up the limited number of spaces per group, we were able to train up the instructors who were already there on the cyanotype process!

Along with these changes, we also decided to split proceeds from the auction with two other organizations, The Root Social Justice Center of Brattleboro, VT and YouthFX of Albany, NY. Through the support of our donors, bidders, and volunteers, our auction was a success! Not only were we able to raise money for our Student Scholarship fund, which 87% of our students utilize, but we were also able to highlight the work and support two other organizations in our community!














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# **ANTIRACIST ACTIONS**

Following the unjust murders of George Floyd, Breona Taylor, Tony McDade, Nina Pop, Sean Reed, and Ahmaud Arbery, we began a serious commitment to anti-racist work.

# In the Summer of 2020, In-Sight recommitted ourselves to engaging in transparent organization-wide anti-racist work. Here are our direct actions as of 12/31/2020:

- We rerouted the \$300 In-Sight made from our T-Shirt sales to the Root Social Justice Center in Brattleboro, Vermont.
- We donated 60% of our auction proceeds to support POC run organizations totallying \$3,000 to Youth FX, of Albany, New York and \$3,000 to The Root Social Justice Center of Brattleboro, Vermont.
- In-Sight began to pay all artists and facilitators for their time, energy, and work.

#### Here are our outstanding commitments:

- We are committed to finding a way to support our Black, Brown, and Indigenous student-artists through scholarship and/or equipment.
- We will create a photographer's guide to responsible photography during protests as well as highlight the racist history of photography.
- Staff and volunteers participate in mandatory training on race, whiteness, and supporting Black, Brown, and Indigenous youth. Staff is committed to participating in monthly trainings.
- We are committed to developing alternatives to calling the police and supporting restorative justice practices.

# We will continue to update our community on our actions as they change and grow and invite feedback with open arms.




The Focus On The Future Capital Campaign is a multiyear effort to raise \$500,000 for the purchase and renovation of a new facility for our growing program.
